

HEALTH: TODAY'S REALITY



There are five simultaneous competing priorities for the use of money. God's Word speaks to each:

LIVE: Practice provision, contentment, and enjoyment because money is a tool. (1 Timothy 4:4, 5:8, 6:6-10; Hebrews 11:24-26)

GIVE: Open my hand to release God's resources. He wants my heart connected to His Kingdom story. (Matthew 6:19-24; 2 Corinthians 9:6-8; Luke 16:13)

OWE(DEBT): Eliminate debt because debt always presumes upon the future. (Proverbs 22:7; James 4:13-16)

OWE(TAXES): Pay taxes with gratitude. They reflect God's provision. (Matthew 22:17-21)

GROW: Demonstrate financial maturity by giving up today's desires for tomorrow's benefit. (Proverbs 6:6-8; Luke 12:16-21)

FINANCIAL STEW-ARDSHIP

We want to continuously praise and thank God for what He is doing among us at Fellowship Bible Church. His hand is evident, and His plans are good! Whether you are new to Fellowship or have been attending for years, we're also thankful for you! It is your faithfulness that allows us to move toward our shared mission and vision, and we could not move forward without you. Whether you're beginning your faith journey, establishing your faith in classes and worship services, serving others by volunteering, or multiplying your faith through discipleship, we celebrate what God is doing in you!

One critical area of ministry that can get overlooked is the need for consistent faithful giving, and your faithful giving allows us to continue ministry in a healthy, sustainable way. We are committed to being transparent and upfront about the financial health of the church. This Vision Guide will provide you clarity into the makeup of our funds, the status of giving this year, why giving is important, and how to easily make giving a part of your faith journey at Fellowship.

FINANCIAL STEWARDSHIP(CONT)

We view our budget as one comprehensive budget made of 3 major pieces. Each is critical to long-term ministry health, and is designed with a specific purpose in mind.

Our **Operating Budget** is designed to allow for daily, fundamental ministry needs that are happening now. This budget covers basic needs like the following areas:

- Building utilities & Maintenance
- Services (website, live-streaming, software)
- Equipment (kitchen equipment, computers, furniture)
- Ministry supplies (curriculum, crafts, snacks)
- Salary (pastors, full-time staff, part-time staff)

Our Missions & Outreach Budget is designed to allow us to take the gospel into our local community as well as the ends of the earth:

- Local ministry support (CareNet, Mission Waco)
- Global Baptist Banjara Ministries International
- US based missionary teams
- Global missionary teams

HABITS: FIVE BIBLICAL PRINCIPLES



Finally, our **Capital Fund** is designed to allow us to prepare and grow for tomorrow's ministry needs and future generations. This fund covers the following areas:

- Paying off Phase II building debt and preparing for a future Phase III. We have placed ourselves on an accelerated pay-off plan to get to Phase III as soon as we can.
- Timely repairs for unforeseen emergencies too large for our Operating Budget to handle. For instance, several years ago we were able to quickly repair a costly underground water pipe rupture using emergency funds.
- We are always looking to make the most of what God has already blessed us with by making improvements to our existing campus (upgraded live-streaming equipment, energy-saving LED lighting upgrades, etc.)

These three pieces make up our comprehensive annual budget. Each year we present this budget to the church for affirmation. Our 2022 budget affirmation is scheduled for January.




GIVING STATUS & BUDGETS

Each month, we provide financial updates in our bulletin to show progress in our comprehensive annual budget. We hope that these updated graphics are easy to read and help you better understand how we are doing as a church financially and the importance of your financial contribution to doing ministry. SUPPLEMENTAL MATERIAL

The following guide is provided by the Ron Blue Institute and can walk you through a biblical perspective on financial stewardship.

HEART: BEHAVIOR FOLLOWS BELIEF



STEWARDSHIP: Do I believe that God owns it all?

CONTENTMENT: Do I believe that what I have right now is enough?

FAITH: Do I believe that I demonstrate my faith through my finances?

WISDOM: Do I believe that God's wisdom is true and available?

As of Nov. 7th, the **Operating Budget** is currently \$138,000 under our giving goal for the year. If giving does not meet our giving goals we are able to temporarily use cash on hand to cover any shortages. We are committed to continuing critical ministries and trust fully in God's continual provision at Fellowship. *Thank you for being a part of keeping our ministries going and facilities running!*

As of Nov. 7th, the **Missions & Outreach Budget** is currently \$5,000 over our giving goal for the year. We are committed to funding our missionaries and partner organizations. **Thank you for enabling important evangelical work in our community and world!**

As of Nov. 7th, the **Capital Fund** is currently \$35,000 under our giving goal for the year. We are currently paying off the Phase II building at an accelerated rate and have a good deal of flexibility to lower these monthly payments if needed, but our hope is to pay off this loan as soon as possible. We routinely have planned upgrades that we hold until funding is available. **Thank you for helping us invest in the beautiful campus God has blessed us with!**



WHY GIVING IS IMPORTANT

In the book of Matthew, Jesus teaches us to value heavenly things over earthly things:

"Do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust destroy, and where thieves break in and steal. But store up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust destroys, and where thieves do not break in or steal; for where your treasure is, there your heart will be also."

Matthew 6:19-21

When you give at Fellowship, rest assured you are directly investing in ministry. While we simply cannot do ministry without your presence, time, and energy, your financial support is also critical. No matter how small the donation, every dollar helps significantly. In fact, did you know that a gift of only \$25 per month would be enough to maintain our website or our online sermon videos? These resources reach people around the globe! A slightly larger gift of \$250 per month is enough to purchase an entire year's worth of new curriculum for all of our elementary classes! A larger one-time gift could help significantly as we pay down our remaining debt on Phase II and prepare for a future Phase III! We are down to less than \$350,000 on our original loan for Phase II's \$4,000,000 building cost. We trust that God will provide for the Church and we want you to make your own financial decisions based on prayerful consideration of how God would have you support Fellowship financially. As a church, we strive to develop faithful giving where every believer is giving together.
