

Are You Ready? Revelation 1:1-8

How do we know if we are ready for Christ's return?

Four main perspectives have been taken to interpret Revelation:

- The *preterist approach* views Revelation not as future prophecy, but as a historical record of events in the first-century Roman Empire.
- The *historicist approach* portrays Revelation as a record of the sweep of church history from apostolic times to the present.
- The *idealist approach* views Revelation as the timeless struggle between good and evil that is played out in every age.
- The *futurist approach* sees chapters 4–22 as predictions of people and events yet to come in the future.

As Christians we are preparing for Christ's return when we...

1. Know what is to come

"But do not let this one fact escape your notice, beloved, that with the Lord one day is like a thousand years, and a thousand years like one day. The Lord is not slow about His promise, as some count slowness, but is patient toward you, not wishing for any to perish but for all to come to repentance."
