One: Three Series Overviews

Holy Habits -

When God calls us to himself, he sets us apart—he makes us holy. But what does it mean to be holy? What habits define God's people, no matter where they are on earth or which denomination they are a part of? In this four-session series, we explore four foundational behaviors of Christians. God calls us to a new way of living, one formed by rhythms of holiness.

Beatitudes -

What does it mean to be blessed? And, more importantly, how do we become someone who is blessed? The kind of life God is calling us to may not look the way we imagined, but it will be better than we could have hoped.

In this eight-session series, we walk through the Beatitudes and shows us what it means to live in the kingdom of God. Through Jesus's teaching, learn what the blessed life really looks like.

The Reason for God -

In his New York Times bestselling book The Reason for God, Timothy Keller established himself as a modern-day C. S. Lewis who brings together faith and intellect, theology and popular culture, modern-day objections and historic Christian beliefs.

Christians will be challenged to wrestle with their friends and neighbors' hardest questions, and to engage those questions in ways that will spark an honest, enriching, and humbling dialogue. Capture a live and unscripted conversation between Timothy Keller and the six panelists discussing their objections to Christianity. This study will help small groups and individuals dig deeper into the objections of the Christian faith and to learn about both sides of the issues.

Sessions include:

- 1. Isn't the Bible a Myth?
- 2. How Can You Say There Is Only One Way to God?
- 3. What Gives You the Right to Tell Me How to Live My Life?
- 4. Why Does God Allow Suffering?
- 5. Why Is the Church Responsible for So Much Injustice?
- 6. How Can God Be Full of Love and Wrath at the Same Time?

Nehemiah -

Whether we've felt spiritually stale or devoured by doubts, we've all wanted God to renew us. But what does spiritual restoration even look like?

The book of Nehemiah tells the story of God's power to restore his people. As Israel returned from exile to the Promised Land, they found the walls of Jerusalem in shambles. So God equipped Nehemiah to rebuild the wall and lead the discouraged Israelites. In this 10-session series, we see how God renewed his people both physically and spiritually. Through the story of Israel's plight and God's faithfulness, we see how God preserved his people to carry out his mission of redemption.

Confronting Jesus -

Jesus is the most famous human being in all of history. But while many people have a basic sketch of Jesus in their minds, comparatively few have taken time to read the four biographies of his life in the New Testament Gospels of Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John.

In this video study, Rebecca McLaughlin teaches on the important biblical context of the Gospels and why they should be taken seriously as historical documents. Exploring eyewitness testimony about Jesus, McLaughlin points to him as a first-century Jewish man who is the Son of God, the promised King, mighty healer, greatest teacher, lover of sinners, suffering servant, perfect sacrifice, and universal Lord. *Confronting Jesus* is designed to help individuals and groups understand the message of the Gospels and explore who Jesus really is.

The Life of Mary -

The Life of Mary is a 4-part Bible study that unfolds Mary's life and transforms it to a 21st century audience In this series, we make insightful discoveries on Mary's unique situation and brings to life her fears and struggles.

With powerful lessons and excellent teaching, this study examines Mary's life in a way you would never expect. Each session walks down Mary's road of faith as she journeys through a life of unbelievable events that ushers in Jesus Christ.
