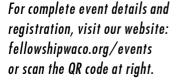

How do you have healthy and holy relationships?

The pattern for promoting healthy and holy relationships:

Start with our own heart

(1 Tim. 4:10-16 review)

Grow in grace

Follow His word

1 Timothy 5:1-2











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The God-honoring way to have healthy and holy relationships:

Relating to older men as fathers 5:1a

Relating to younger men as brothers 5:1b

Relating to older women as mothers 5:2a

Relating to younger women as sisters 5:2b
